Trangie Central School (enrolment 184 students - 88 primary, 96 secondary, and 101 of whom are Aboriginal) is a comprehensive K-12 school located in a productive rural area in the Central West of NSW. The school receives needs-based equity loading for Socio-economic Background, Aboriginal Background, Low Level Adjustment for Disability and a Location Loading. The school was included in the 2020 CESE list of high performing schools, as a case study in the "What Works Best" package for its practices promoting high expectations and wellbeing. The school was also recognised in 2016 and 2019 as an Innovative School, for its work in developing innovative programs around the 21C capabilities across STEM and Stage 5 entrepreneurship, as well as wellbeing programs. Students are actively involved in all facets of school life, with the focus being on promoting student voice and developing and nurturing student leadership skills. Active communication with and participation in the community is a high priority for our school.
