We are in the beautiful Upper Clarence Valley, sitting proudly on Wahlubal land. A small but cohesive staff work together to improve the wellbeing and life opportunities of the 74 K-12 students from Bonalbo, Old Bonalbo, Tabulam and Drake. 30% of our students identify as First Nations peoples. The school is supported by the P&C and local AECG and works closely with other 'West of the Range' schools. We have excellent facilities, including multi-purpose hall, sporting grounds, agricultural facilities, outdoor gym and quality ICT resources. The teacher would be on the K/1 class, which has 10 students. Teachers provide high quality classroom teaching aimed at securing outstanding academic and wellbeing outcomes for all students; demonstrate a commitment to supporting the delivery of the school's SIP; establish and maintain strong community links through effective parent liaison; work collaboratively with colleagues; and be willing to organise and lead various aspects within the primary faculty.
