Position Information

As Relieving Head Teacher of English at Fairvale High School you will lead a dynamic faculty. As well as overseeing English Year 7-12 you will also be taking on Head Teacher Drama including the monitoring of Stage Six courses. We offer all Stage 6 courses in English including English Extension 1 and English Extension 2. A willingness to teach Drama and Extension English 1 and 2 is preferred. You will work closely with the Head Teacher EAL/D and Literacy to support our EAL/D students. You will be required to submit a 3-page CV and provide 2 references. There is a possibility the position will extend beyond Term 2.
