Blayney High School is a small rural comprehensive school in the Central West of NSW situated within a 40-minute drive from two larger regional towns (Bathurst and Orange). The school population is steady at approximately 325 students inclusive of 12.85% Aboriginal students and approximately 27% students with additional needs. Over 70% of students are from low SES backgrounds. Students come from a wide area, many from the small rural villages and the local town-based schools known as the Heritage Schools Learning Community.

Blayney High School has an excellent reputation within the education districts and wider community and has a strong tradition of providing an inclusive education that not only addresses the academic needs of the students but provides opportunities and wellbeing programs to support all students. Our goal is success for every student.

Blayney High School has a very committed teaching, administrative and executive staff with a range of experience.
