Leumeah High School is a comprehensive coeducational high school situated on Dharawal Country in South Western Sydney. Students and staff have a deep respect for the traditional custodians of the land in which they live, learn and work. The school has an enrolment of 702 students, with around 45% having a language background other than English and an additional 9% being First Nations students. The school includes a Support Unit named Bundalong, which consists of three Autism Spectrum classes.

The school boasts a broad academic curriculum, with future-focused learning at its core. As an Apple Distinguished School, all students are equipped with iPads to access innovative teaching and learning programs. Faculties drive the implementation of innovative pedagogy designed to enhance the capacity of each student to thrive in an increasingly digital world.

The highly dedicated and committed staff play a crucial role in creating a collaborative learning environment providing students with opportunities to succeed that extend beyond the classroom.
